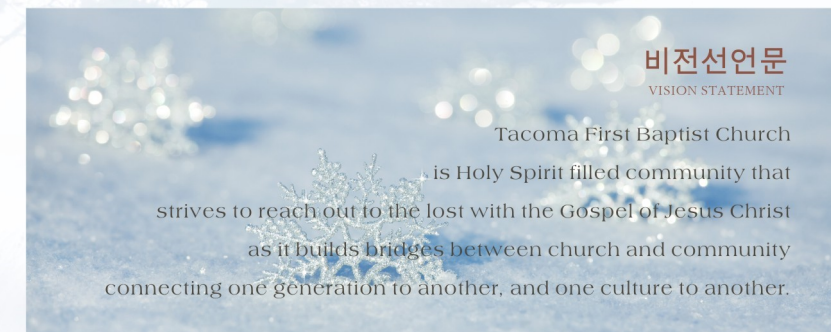

After visiting Holy Land and Martyrdom places in Japan for 5 days, I have returned to Korea and getting ready to preach on Sunday at Global Mission Church. Through the holy land visit in Japan, I was shocked and challenged through the grace of God. I read two books on Spirituality of Suffering and Persecution on the flights. Today's letter, I want to share what I have gained from those books.

Today's Church is focused on how to eliminate the sufferings as it pursues the comfort of daily life. Comparably, the early church found any means necessary to eliminate the evils of the world. Out of those two stands, what is more fitting to the gospel message? One of the focus on the gospel is eliminating pain. However it is not the goal of the gospel but one of the end results of the gospel. Healing or comforting a patient with depression, seeking for needs, pursuing happiness, all these are needed elements in our lives. But, if what we all desire is about no sickness, no enemies, and continuous success, then, maybe we might be drifting down somewhere else.

We are called to resist the authorities of the world, success, fame, materialism, sexual desires, idol worship. This holy calling must have power of vulnerability to boldly overcome the suffering and persecution that this world gives. 1 Corinthians 2:3, I came to you in weakness with great fear and trembling.

Evangelists of Korean churches only taught half the salvation. The core element of the gospel is God's giving one and only child to die on the cross to give us a new life. Through the new life we need to live with new heart. Bible teaches us to be faithful servants. However, Korean churches have forgotten the second part. They have ignored to connect the new life to their actual lives. They started to live double lives. The essence of the gospel has been disappearing and self comforting religions is what is left of Christianity. (The interview with Pastor Junggil Hong, March 31)

Even in the western world, Christianity has been pushed to the side and many Christians are not able to define the true essence of the Christian faith and living in a culture where gospel is not fully complete. The Christians in the first 3 centuries have faced the similar situation.

Specific situations might differ but there are similarities. Churches in Post Modernism era are focusing on weakness of themselves rather than the strength. The early church did not remind of that since they were constantly facing persecutions and martyrdom. However, the churches today are avoiding the current situations and only acknowledge weakens as failures and power as success. Who would want to recognize their own failures. This is the paradox of the cross that we must hold onto. In order to follow Christ, we need to be ready to abandon our own power, rights and status on our own. (Rose Dowsett, OMF)
