As I have left Korea in November, 1995, now, I am at the point of finishing my 24 years of immigrant life. There is no other time than now that Korean immigrants are worried about the Korean peninsula and South Korea society. The crisis of today is new challenge for us and the last challenge of the era.

March 1st movement had 100th anniversary this year. Back then, there was only 1.8% of Christians. Among many who were imprisoned because of the March 1st movement, 24% were Christians and 33 people representative of Korea had more than half as Christians. Christianity was minority but led the independent movement and serve as leaders to influence the society.

During the revival era of 1970s and 1980s, churches were the lights for the Korea. Not only praying for Gospel and God's kingdom, but prayed for the country and the people and even North Koreans. The church was in front line praying for the people. Society respected the function of the church and many respected the church-

However, from certain point, the churches started to distance themselves from the society. Churches were getting bigger and focusing on individual blessing and healing but turned their back against social issues. Even as time passed, churches started to get behind the society.

When God builds a church, it is to be the salt and light of this world but churches started to build their own Babel and wasting their energies. They were just focused on a number growth and started to lose the true fundamentals. As the world changed each day and no longer seek the truth, churches were valuing their success as their secular values.

With many challenges, church were distancing from the world and instead of being salt and light for the pains of the world, only focused on their sanctuary and church building focused mindsets. Even churches now criticize their own issues in themselves. Individualism, materialism, number growth focus, unchanged life of church members, and many experts gives answers to all these issues but rather than discussion the answers, you need to focus on one thing because without it, you will

What did churches lose? What is one thing we must find against and be restored within the church? It is Jesus Christ. What we must be restored is Jesus in the church. More than anything, Jesus must be revealed. As we say a church is a hope of the world but without proclaiming Jesus at church, churches are no longer the hope for the world.
