As we devote ourselves to raise the new generations through VBS, Awana, and Ko-rean school, another important group is senior adults. Compared to Seattle, the num-ber of Korean senior adults are increasing.

They are also important labors. Many of them serve at fellowship ministries and kitchen ministries. Many of them also serve at VBS as kitchen volunteers as younger generations serve as teachers. It is the same for the early morning prayers.

Senior Adults might have retired from the job in this world, they are still active at church and serving according to their gift. They have the time and the training and experiences. For that, the senior college is an important ministry to share the gospel to non-believers and also see the potentials in the senior adults.

Yesterday's special back to school morning service, more than expected children and students attended the service. Especially many youth were there (Due to the retreat effects) Their attitude to worship was very serious. Many stayed and prayed together. After the message, the first generation raised their hands to pray for the next genera-tions.

As I was praying, my heart was touched. It was precious sight for the young parents to bring their children but also the older generations whose children are already grown up. They raised their hands to pray, I felt like this was the connecting point.

If we are able to do the ministry to connect one generation to another in the name of Jesus, the church will continue to move forward to where God is pleased and God will pour new revival once again. The fall wind is great. I expect the new work of the Holy Spirit.
