One more thing to add is that tomorrow is Memorial Day. This is the long weekend and this is the beginning of summer vacation season yet it is a special day. It started as a day to remember those who died in the civil war but after World War I, it changed to remembering the deceased soldiers from all wars.

Memorial day is special day for our church families. The reason that we celebrated the memorial day in 2012 with the joint service, preaching on Korean wars, and holding events for Korean War veterans, is to encourage and comfort the veterans and families. The pain that they carry for their lives, for civilians it gets forgotten often. This is not just a long weekend but a day to give thanks to God for giving us freedom and also show gratitude to all those who have served and are serving to protect this country. Also to the families of militaries as well. Love must be expressed.
